Actions

A solution like this can become cost effective in a short time and provide local jobs such as deployment specialists, IT professionals, epidemiologists, contract specialists and communications.

Results

The result we expect is to deliver mobile electronic patient tools to help record and identify patient data and compile the regional data into usable data to help deliver supplies, service or pharmaceuticals to places with greatest need and calculated impact.
